# Sustainable mobility transitions: The challenge for European cities



- EU Green Deal, 90% reduction in transport emissions by 2050
- Over 70% of European citizens live in cities, 23% of all transport GHG emissions.
- Achieve carbon neutrality by 2030 (100 cities) and for all, by 2050.

## What does it mean for cities ?

- to accelerate and intensify the shift,
  - to transform existing infrastructures and networks,
  - to work across sectors,
  - to engage with every segment of society
- 
- ... over 30 years ... and facing adaptation limits.

**=> Beyond technological fixes, governance and public policies play a critical role in reconciling diverging interests, setting a common vision and steering transformative change over time.**
