The FastTrack approach to assessing innovation performance

Summary of D4.1: "FastTrack Innovation and Knowledge Strategy"

To ensure that FastTrack's work is effective and scalable, it is important to assess how the project transfers knowledge to its local areas, and how this knowledge increases local capacities, and improves innovation implementation. FastTrack is also using "Innovation Performance" assessment to gauge its local areas' capacities to swiftly roll-out innovations, and to help identify factors that may enhance innovation capacity at the local level. **Deliverable 4.1 presents FastTrack's novel assessment approach.**

The project assesses innovation performance in two ways: (i) by mapping the "city innovation profile" of its local areas; and (ii) by analysing the efficiency and impact of its capacity building programme through a set of key performance indicators. The innovation performance methods will allow cities to identify their innovation strengths and blind spots. In fact, innovation "blindness" is the focus; FastTrack will provide "lenses" to help local areas see new aspects and actions that help them achieve sustainability goals in fast-changing systems.

FastTrack is assessing "city innovation profiles", using (and building on) guidelines developed by the CREATE project. FastTrack's second line of assessment is monitoring and refining the knowledge it provides to its local areas, using a thorough list of key performance indicators that measure the efficiency and impact of the FastTrack capacity building programme.

The **city innovation profile** is explained in Chapter 3 of Deliverable 4.1 (page 14), and can be easily taken-up and used by others! The assessment method has already been used to generate the innovation profile for each of the FastTrack local areas. The steps for **monitoring and refining the FastTrack knowledge framework** is presented in Chapter 4 (page 41).
